- 1. Woodhouse is a street in Port Dover, a city on the north shore of Lake Erie.

Harriet Emma Buck, known better as Hattie, was the youngest of five female children, pages 2, 3 and 4. Married two weeks before her 16th birthday, Hattie set out with her husband Richard Norman Lanyon, better known as Dick, leaving her home in Ontario, Canada, to settle in Rockford, Illinois. Soon pregnant, Hattie bore her first child ten months later. This is a picture of a brave and courageous young woman. Over the course of 25 years, she gave birth to ten and raised nine children. Her fourth child didn't survive infancy.

In the early 1900s, her husband was running a business in Indiana and was absent at least part of the time, and although most of her children were grown, she had two young sons to raise. Also, her daughter Esther, born in 1889 was a troublesome child.

Hattie appeared to enjoy life, pages 5, 6 and 7. It must have been a joy to have a sister live next door.

The last few years of her life were spent during the Great Depression, a time of hardship. She outlived her husband by ten months.

Document titled FAMILY REGISTER. Who prepared it and when is unknown. Stamford is a neighborhood in Niagara Falls, Ontario. Crowland is a neighborhood in Welland, Ontario. Port Dover and Simcoe are towns in Norfolk County, Ontario, about 70 miles west of Niagara Falls. Crowland is about 10 miles southwest of Niagara Falls, Ontario. Caledonia is about 40 miles west of Niagara Falls, Ontario.

Note that Avichouser is spelled with an "o" rather than an "a" found elsewhere. Hattie and Dick's family listed at the bottom is incomplete, there were several more children. The two witnesses in the hand-written marriage certificate item may be the spouses of Elizabeth Howard and Alice Williamson, two of the five female children of Daniel and Martha.
